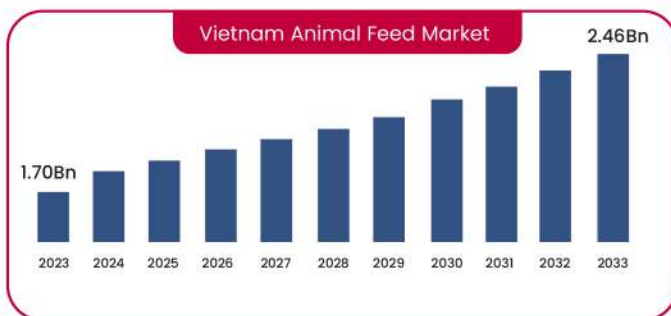

- Growing foreign direct investment

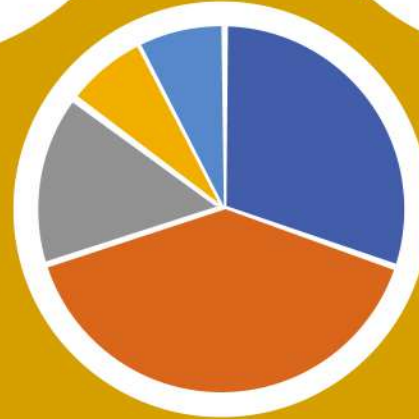

Cashew Market Overview



The global processed cashew market is undergoing rapid transformation, driven by rising health awareness, product innovation, and evolving supply chains dynamics, and rising production costs.

Vietnam remains one of the world's leading processors and exporters of cashews, facing both opportunities and challenges from shifting consumer preferences, geopolitical dynamics, and rising production costs.

DDGS Market

Vietnam is a major importer of Dried Distillers Grains with Solubles (DDGS) for its booming livestock/aquaculture sectors, presenting a significant export opportunity for India due to geographical proximity and cost advantages, despite the US and Brazil being dominant suppliers; Indian suppliers must ensure consistent quality and competitive pricing to capture market share from these traditional sources and meet the growing demand for protein-rich feed ingredients in Southeast Asia



Vietnam's DDGS Demand & Opportunity for India

High Demand: Vietnam is Southeast Asia's largest feed consumer, with massive imports of maize and DDGS for its aquaculture and poultry industries.

Diversification: Vietnamese feed mills are actively diversifying from traditional suppliers (US, Brazil) to gain cost benefits, creating an opening for Indian DDGS.

Logistical Advantage: India's proximity offers shorter shipping times (7-10 days vs. 25+ days from the US), ensuring better feed quality upon arrival.

India's Role & Potential

Growing Supplier: India's expanding ethanol industry is boosting DDGS production, with exports to Vietnam and Malaysia showing higher profitability than domestic sales.

Competitive Edge: Indian DDGS offers energy and protein, acting as a valuable substitute for corn and soybean meal in feed formulations.

Key Players: Indian suppliers like Nutrigo Feeds and Prorich Agro are actively exporting corn DDGS, focusing on quality and meeting specific market needs.

DE OILED RICE BRAN Market



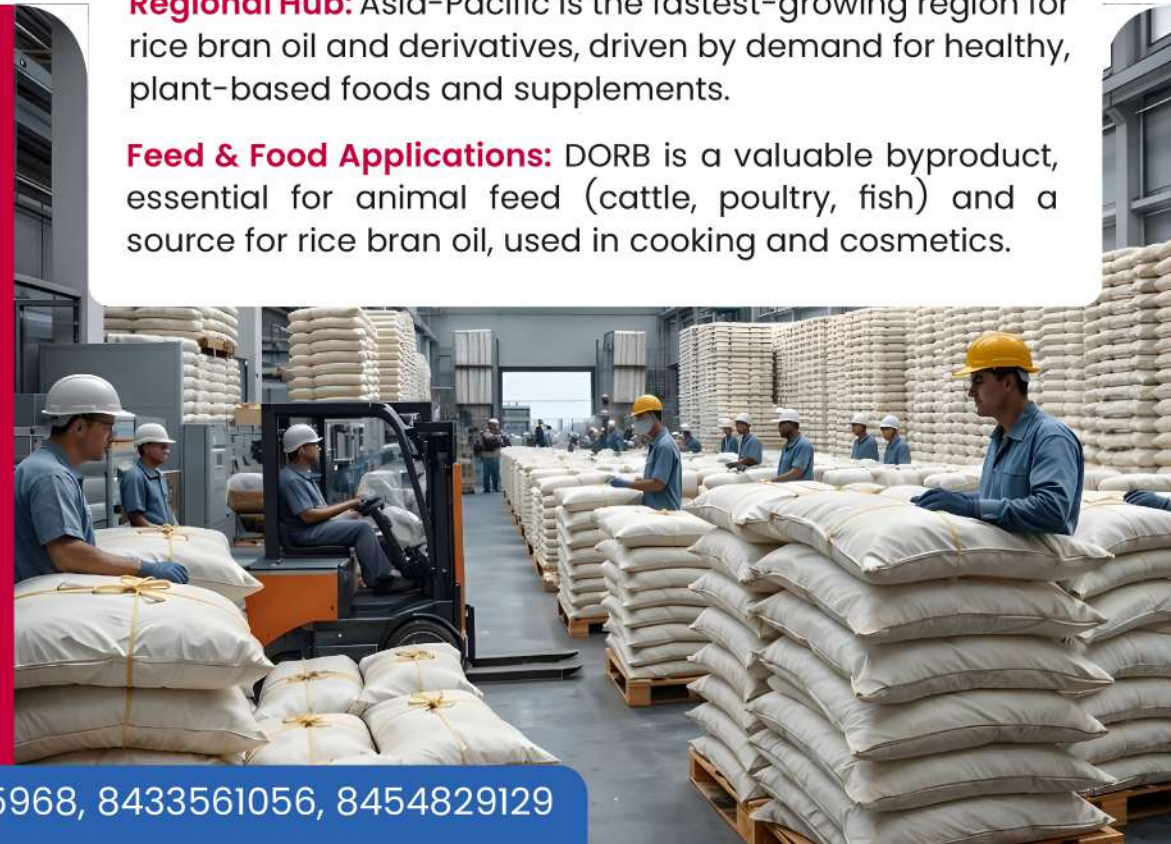
The de-oiled rice bran (DORB) market in Southeast Asia, especially Vietnam, heavily relies on India as a primary supplier, using it as an affordable protein/fiber source for animal feed, particularly poultry and aquaculture. After an export ban in India (imposed July 2023, lifted October 2025) disrupted supply, the lifting of this ban is restoring India's role as a key supplier to Vietnam, Thailand, and other Asian markets, benefiting Indian processors and boosting regional feed availability.

India's Role: India is a significant producer and exporter of DORB, with its lifting of the export ban in late 2025 expected to revitalize its agro-processing exports, benefiting eastern Indian millers and farmers.

Vietnam's Demand: Vietnam stands as a top global importer of DORB, relying on countries like India for this crucial ingredient, primarily for feed manufacturing.

Regional Hub: Asia-Pacific is the fastest-growing region for rice bran oil and derivatives, driven by demand for healthy, plant-based foods and supplements.

Feed & Food Applications: DORB is a valuable byproduct, essential for animal feed (cattle, poultry, fish) and a source for rice bran oil, used in cooking and cosmetics.





India's Shift & Impact

Ban Lift: India's decision to lift the DORB export ban (previously in place since 2023) allows it to re-establish itself as a reliable global supplier, improving local prices for byproductst

Increased Processing: This policy encourages greater rice bran processing, boosting domestic rice bran oil production, which India, a large importer of other oils, needs to reduce its dependence.

Southeast Asia & Global Context

Key Importers: Besides Vietnam, Nepal and Bangladesh are major global importers, often sourcing from India and Pakistan.

Market Growth: The overall rice bran derivatives market is projected for robust growth (CAGR ~9-10%), driven by increased consumer focus on natural, healthy ingredients and plant-based diets.



The Southeast Asian (SEA) wheat bran market, including Vietnam, shows strong growth, driven by rising demand for animal feed (especially for livestock/aquaculture) and bakery/processed foods, with SEA projected to reach over \$32M by 2033, while India remains a major Asia-Pacific player, its wheat bran market influenced by domestic wheat production and export potential, with recent MSP hikes indicating government support for farmers, though production growth has slowed recently. Both regions benefit from increasing demand for healthy, fiber-rich products, but face supply chain challenges, with SEA importing more feed ingredients like wheat.

Vietnam & Southeast Asia Market

Growth Drivers: Rapid expansion of livestock and aquaculture sectors, diversified diets, growth in instant noodles/bakery, and demand for fiber-rich foods.

Key Applications: Animal Feed is the fastest-growing segment; Bakery leads in market size.

Trade: Increased imports of wheat and other feed ingredients like corn (due to declining local production/exports of rice/cassava bran).

Outlook: SEA market estimated to grow from ~\$23M (2024) to ~\$32M by 2033, with a ~3.68% CAGR. Vietnam's wheat imports were forecast higher for 2024/25.



Corn Market

Import demand is driven by animal feed, food, and starch industries, with Argentina remaining a key supplier, though imports dipped slightly year-on-year by late 2025. India plays an important role as both a major corn producer and supplier of derivatives like DDGS to Vietnam, while also serving a growing domestic market. Rising demand from ethanol and food sectors continues, despite price pressure from heavy arrivals. Southeast Asia, including Indonesia, remains a major global importer influencing trade flows.



Import Focus: Vietnam is a major importer, heavily reliant on foreign corn for its booming animal feed, food processing, and biofuel sectors, especially for poultry and swine.

Key Supplier: Argentina dominated in the first half of 2025, holding over 53% of Vietnam's imports.

Market Trends: Imports declined slightly in volume but prices rose in early 2025, with a significant rebound in August 2025 volumes from July, though still below the prior year.

Production & Demand: Strong domestic demand from food, ethanol (DDGS), and starch industries drives significant production, especially in Western India (Maharashtra, Gujarat).

Export Role: India is a competitive exporter to Southeast Asia, offering products like DDGS (a byproduct of ethanol) as a cost-effective alternative to Western suppliers, notes Nutrigo Feeds.

Market Dynamics: Faced pressure from heavy arrivals but saw price surges during the lean season in late 2025, with potential for growth in starch and ethanol sectors.





Rice Bran Market

The global rice bran oil market was valued at USD 2.25 billion in 2025 and is projected to grow from USD 2.47 billion in 2026 to USD 3.94 billion by 2031, registering a CAGR of 9.78% during the forecast period. This steady growth reflects rice bran oil's evolution from an underutilized agricultural byproduct into a premium cooking oil. Market expansion is supported by extensive scientific research confirming its cardiovascular health benefits and superior thermal stability, which make it especially suitable for high-temperature cooking across foodservice and household applications worldwide.



Consumer demand continues to strengthen as numerous clinical studies substantiate the oil's effectiveness in reducing total cholesterol and LDL levels, solidifying its position as a preferred choice among health-conscious consumers. However, the industry faces challenges as climate-related uncertainties affect rice crop yields, which directly impact bran availability. In response, processing companies are making strategic investments in advanced stabilization technologies and sophisticated cold-chain logistics infrastructure to safeguard their operational margins and ensure consistent supply.



Milled Wheat Market



Milled wheat market in Southeast Asia, particularly Vietnam, shows strong demand driven by growing economies, processed food, and aquafeed, with Vietnam being a significant flour exporter, while India's role shifts towards domestic focus but remains a supplier to key Asian markets like South Korea and Japan, with competitive pricing supported by favorable local crop conditions and government support for farmers.



High Milling Capacity: Vietnam has significant milling capacity, exceeding current domestic food demand, indicating growth expectations for flour exports and aquafeed use.

Flour Exports: Vietnam is a major regional flour exporter, benefiting from ASEAN tariff free access, with key markets including Thailand and the Philippines.

Demand Drivers: Rising incomes, urbanization, and the booming processed food sector fuel demand for wheat products like noodles, bakery items, and biscuits.

Key Players: Major mills like Vimaflour, Mekong, Interflour, and Bing Dong dominate the market.

Domestic Focus: India prioritizes domestic consumption, though it remains a key wheat producer and exporter.

Export Destinations: India exports high-quality wheat (like Sharbati) to South Korea, Japan, the UAE, and Iraq, with potential for regional sales.

Favorable Production: The 2025 crop benefited from good soil moisture, leading to strong local supply and stable pricing, as seen by unchanged quotes.




MSP Support: Government support, like the increased Minimum Support Price (MSP) for the 2025-26 season, encourages production.



TECHNOLOGY, WAREHOUSING & LOGISTICS

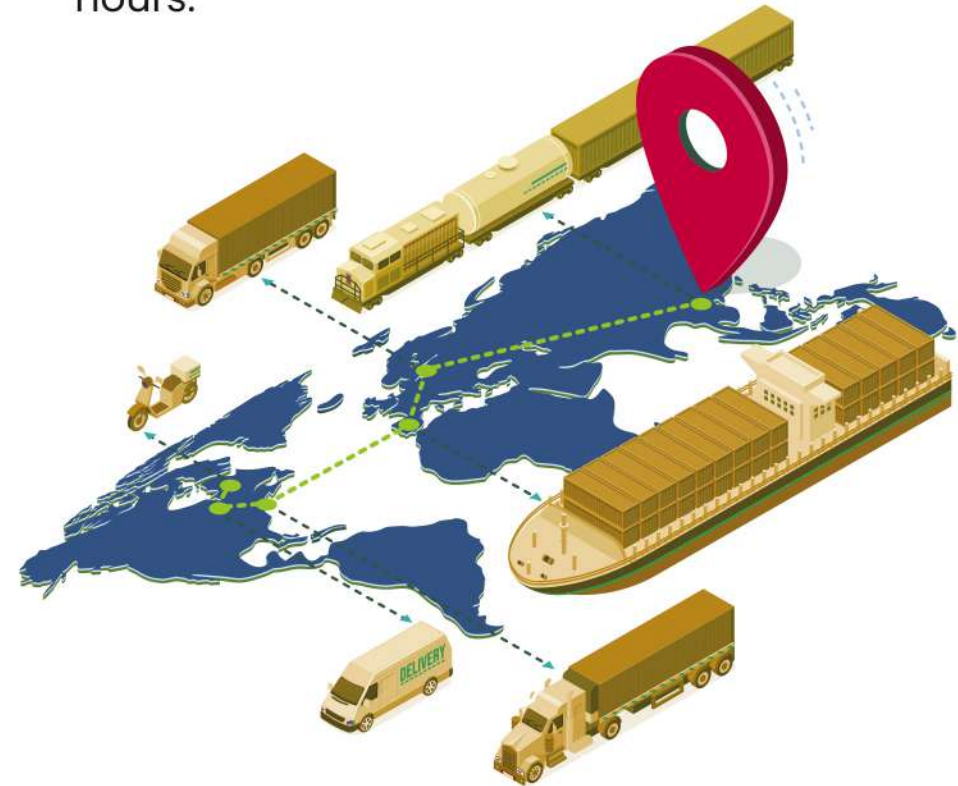
Vietnam's warehousing market reached USD 5.84 billion in 2025 and is projected to grow at a CAGR of 11.2%, reaching USD 16.88 billion by 2035

Market Insights:

-  Rapid adoption of automation and robotics
-  Deployment of AGVs (Automated Guided Vehicles) in logistics hubs
-  Enhanced efficiency in e-commerce and supply chain operations
